Key learning focus: time adverbials

Writing task: alternative narrative

Description: Write a narrative about where Syd and Grandad end up when they go through the door in the attic. We are going to change 3 sections, where they first end up (instead of a ship), where they discover (instead of the island) and what wonders they find (instead of the shack and animals).
