To develop the technical skills of art and design (line, tone, texture, colour, pattern, shape, 3D form).


To know that art is a process of reflection and refinement not just a final outcome.

Implementation:

How do we do it at Grange Juniors?

Linked to our 'Big Questions', pupils produce a range of outcomes drawing on their knowledge and understanding of the work of artists, craftspeople, architects and designers from a range of times and cultures.

Teachers teach key artistic principles and skills relevant to the critical study so that pupils become proficient in using a range of media.

Pupils apply key artistic principles using sketchbooks to practise skills and to review and modify designs.

Impact:

On leaving Grange Junior School children will:

Be able to talk knowledgeably and critically about a range of artists and significant works of art, linking them to the culture and history within which they were produced.

Be able to use their knowledge and understanding of the key principles of art to review, reflect on and refine ideas over time to produce a range of outcomes using a variety of media.

See themselves as a creative individual and be confident expressing themselves artistically.

What Art & Design looks like at Grange Junior School...

A sequenced series of sessions based around the work of an artist or piece of art which links to the Big Question. Each unit explores a key artistic principle with which pupils experiment, review and refine to hone their skills. At the end of each sequence there is a final outcome based on the artistic works which utilises the key artistic principle.
