They are also taught to recognise diversity within our local community and the wider world. As they do this, they are encouraged to embody our Busy Bee learning values.



## What Religious Education looks like at Grange Junior School...

Religious Education is taught in an open and safe environment. With ample opportunity to explore a range of religions, faiths and beliefs, children are able to describe, explain and analyse these beliefs and practices and discern possible connections between them and their own lives and ways of understanding the world.

Religious Education at Grange Juniors is implemented and based around the Swindon Agreed Syllabus. To enrich the topics that we cover and ensure we provide our children with exciting learning experiences, a variety of visitors and trips are planned and cross-curricular links are made wherever possible.

Regular assemblies, days dedicated to religious education and celebrations of learning help to celebrate the diversity of the school community and promote positive images of people in the wider community, including their beliefs, traditions, culture, language and history.
